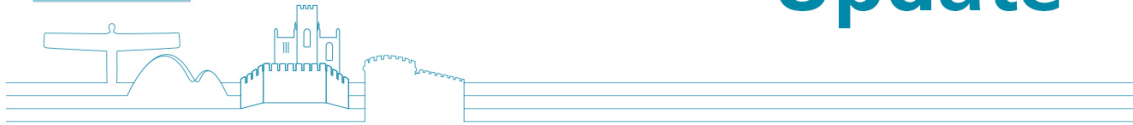

South Tyneside and Sunderland unveil plans for new integrated diagnostic centre

Exciting news from our colleagues at South Tyneside and Sunderland NHS Foundation Trust as they unveiled plans for a new state-of-the-art £10 million Integrated Diagnostic Centre at South Tyneside District Hospital.

This represents fantastic news for patients across Sunderland, South Tyneside and North Durham and is yet another sign of our region being at the forefront of

As we recover from the Covid-19 pandemic and begin to tackle the backlog of patients waiting for care, this new integrated diagnostic centre will help play a pivotal role in reducing waiting lists.

Latest picture in the region

Covid vaccine update

Good news on the vaccine front as from today, 17-year olds who are within three months of their 18th birthday are invited to book their Covid-19 vaccine through the national booking service. This is an important step in ensuring that as much of our communities are protected against the virus as possible and I know work is underway to encourage as much sign up as possible in this age group, with text messages being sent to this age group and letters following to those for who there is no recorded number.

We will also continue to promote the importance of getting the vaccine on our social media pages and we encourage you all do to the same to ensure the message is reaching as many people as possible.

As a region we have also been encouraging expecting mums to ensure they are vaccinated against Covid-19 following the [guidance](#) shared with you last week showing the overwhelming majority of pregnant women hospitalised with the virus have not had a jab.

It was great to see head of midwifery at Northumbria Healthcare, Jenna Wall and public health midwife, Carla Anderson, share this important message on [ITV Tyne Tees](#) earlier this week.

Integrated care system

Over the coming months we are expecting more guidance to be published to support the development of Integrated Care Systems as statutory organisations (subject to parliamentary approvals) from April 2022.

NHS England has recently issued new [guidance](#) for provider collaboratives which sets out the minimum expectations for how providers should work together in provider collaboratives and provides some guiding principles to support local decision-making.

As you know, our [provider collaborative](#) is already established and there are many ways in which we are already working together as part of our recovery and to improve access to services. We will be looking at what this guidance means for us and the best approach for our region.
